Celebrating 58 Years of Breeding genetics for the Australian beef industry, Gerald and Lynden Spry of Sprys Shorthorns & Sprys-W Angus on property annual sale had a 100 percent clearance.

44 Shorthorn bulls sold to a top of \$60,000 and averaged what is believed to be a Shorthorn record average of \$20,182.

26 Angus bulls sold to a top of \$52,000 to average \$17,730.

7 Shorthorn females sold to a top of \$32,000 to average \$23,714.

We were very proud to present the group of cattle in this year's sale. Our breeding program is focused on breeding bulls to go into commercial herds whose progeny will finish on grass.

The sale topping Shorthorn bull at \$60,000, Sprys Golden Rod R33 was sold to the Schuller family, Outback Shorthorn Stud, Culcairn while the top selling Angus bull at \$52,000, Sprys-W Paratrooper R601 was purchased by Appleton Cattle co, Alpha QLD. The top priced female, Sprys Boom Time's Lavendar Q59 with a heifer calf at foot sold to Gary Andrew, Earlston, Vic who also purchased two other females.

Volume buyers included Adrian Goode, Wangolina, Kingston SA who purchased 5 bulls along with the Storrier family, Riverview, Hillston who also purchased 5 bulls and Buckingbong Station, Narrandera purchased 4 bulls.
